<i>Positive can do attitude.</i>

Driver attributes	Access and manage risk	Driving technique	On the road delivery
Punctual	Recognises hazards through scanning ahead	Has completed a full vehicle check prior deployment	Both hands on the wheel when driving or conducting manoeuvres
Avoids general conversation	Checks mirrors regularly (front and rear)	Scan ahead, aware of potential hazards	Correct hand position (9 & 3 o'clock)
Keeps all conversation formal	Conducts head searches (doesn't rely only on mirrors)	Brake early and evenly	Remains aware of passenger comfort
Well groomed	Plans any lane changes in advance	Smooth acceleration	Other road users are aware of manoeuvres through the use of signals
Courteous to all clients and other road users	Indicates 3 seconds prior to changing lanes	Progressive acceleration from a stopped position or when increasing speed	Arrives confidently and manages hazards
Drives in a safe manner at all times	Remains aware of the location of other road users at all times	Remains aware of environment and conducts head searches	Drives defensively and keeps good following-distance
Preparation and planning result in an excellent customer experience	Know routes to take and has a planned itinerary	Remains aware of other road users at all times	Delivers on excellent customer experience
