

WAIKATO STADIUM

128 Seddon Road, Hamilton

CAPACITY: 30.000

Where possible Team 2011 will be provided with options for free public transport to and from their home to their place of work. Where free public transport is not available, there may be options for free car parking in close proximity to the Workforce Centre, stadium or place of work.

Team 2011 will need to be wearing their workforce uniform and accreditation pass to access free public transport.

Public Transport

Public transport will be the easiest way to get to and from Waikato Stadium. There will be free public transport on match days.

Car

There is little public parking adjacent to the venue so it is recommended that public transport is used or walking in from central Hamilton.

Walking

It is a short walk from central Hamilton to Waikato Stadium. The route is clearly signposted.

Late Night Transport

With evening games and Fanzone activities, a large number of the workforce will have shifts that run until late in the evening. All Team 2011 are encouraged to:

- Travel in pairs or groups
- Use free public transport provided
- Ensure the health and safety of others (i.e. escort someone to their car)
- Take responsibility for their own health and safety.

RUGBY PARK

Where possible Team 2011 will be provided with options for free public transport to and from their home to their place of work. Where free public transport is not available, there may be options for free car parking in close proximity to the Workforce Centre, stadium or place of work.

Team 2011 will need to be wearing their workforce uniform and accreditation pass to access free public transport.

Public Transport

Free bus route from 9am - 2pm.

Car

Street parking is available in the area around the stadium but it is recommended that you park in the central city and walk to the stadium. There may be some free parking by the swimming pool (Splash Palace).

Walking

Rugby Park is located an easy 2km walk from central Invercargill. The route will be clearly signposted.

Late Night Transport

With evening games and Fanzone activities, a large number of the workforce will have shifts that run until late in the evening. All Team 2011 are encouraged to:

- · Travel in pairs or groups
- · Use free public transport provided

Walking


Napier's McLean Park is a 1.5km walk from the central city. The route will be clearly signposted.

Team 2011 will need to be wearing their workforce uniform and accreditation pass to access free public transport.

Car

Free car parking is available at Trafalgar Park.

Walking

Trafalgar Park is a short walk from the city centre and is clearly signposted.

With evening games and Fanzone activities, a large number of the workforce will have shifts that run until late in the evening. All Team 2011 are encouraged to:

STADIUM TARANAKI

Maratahu Street, New Plymouth **CAPACITY:** 26,000

Where possible Team 2011 will be provided with options for free public transport to and from their home to their place of work. Where free public transport is not available, there may be options for free car parking in close proximity to the Workforce Centre, stadium or place of work.

Team 2011 will need to be wearing their workforce uniform and accreditation pass to access free public transport.

Public Transport

Free buses will be available and New Plymouth City Council providing shuttles from city to venue.

Car

Parking is limited around the stadium so you are encouraged to walk or use the free buses. Some limited parking will be available 200m from the stadium.

Walking

The walk from central New Plymouth to the stadium is 2km and the route will be clearly signposted.

Late Night Transport

With evening games and Fanzone activities, a large number of the workforce will have shifts that run until late in the evening. All Team 2011 are encouraged to:

- Travel in pairs or groups
- · Use free public transport provided
- Ensure the health and safety of others (i.e. escort someone to their car)

Public Transport

Free public transport will be available throughout Tournament time on buses, trains and all ferries (except Waiheke).

Car

Parking restrictions apply around the venue on match days. It is recommended that free public transport is used.



Car

There will be some free car parking at Marist club rooms and free on-street parking.

Walking

Arena Manawatu is located right in the heart of Palmerston North and the route will be clearly signposted.

Late Night Transport

With an evening game and Fanzone activities, a large number of the workforce will have shifts that run until late in the evening. All Team 2011 are encouraged to:

- Travel in pairs or groups
- Use free public transport provided
- Ensure the health and safety of others (i.e. escort someone to their car)

Where possible Team 2011 will be provided with options for free public transport to and from their home to their place of work. Where free public transport is not available, there may be options for free car parking in close proximity to the Workforce Centre. stadium or place of work.

Team 2011 will need to be wearing their workforce uniform and accreditation pass to access free public transport.

Public Transport

There will be free public transport throughout the Tournament on buses and trains

Car

Parking will be limited so it is recommended public transport is used.

Walking


The stadium is a short walk from Wellington's central business district. The stadium is joined to the elevated 680m-long walkway from the Wellington Railway Station which takes you directly to the stadium entrance.

NORTHLAND EVENTS CENTRE

Okara Drive, Whangarei CAPACITY: 18.000

Where possible Team 2011 will be provided with options for free public transport to and from their home to their place of work. Where free public transport is not available, there may be options for free car parking in close proximity to the Workforce Centre, stadium or place of work.

Team 2011 will need to be wearing their workforce uniform and accreditation pass to access free public transport.

Walking

The Northland Events Centre is an easy 1.5km walk from the central city and clearly signposted.

Car

As parking will be limited near the stadium the easiest option is to park in the city centre and walk to the stadium from there.

There may be some public parking provision at Cobham Oval.

Late Night Transport

With evening games and Fanzone activities, a large number of the workforce will have shifts that run until late in the evening. All Team 2011 are encouraged to:

- Travel in pairs or groups
- Use free public transport provided
- Ensure the health and safety of others (i.e. escort someone to their car)

Team 2011 will need to be wearing their workforce uniform and accreditation pass to access free public transport.

Car

Free car parking around the Octagon on match days and it is recommended you walk to the stadium from there.

Walking

Otago Stadium is an easy 2km walk from the central city. The route will be clearly signposted.

Late Night Transport

With evening games and Fanzone activities, a large number of the workforce will have shifts that run until late in the evening.

All Team 2011 are encouraged to:

- Travel in pairs or groups
- · Use free public transport provided
- Ensure the health and safety of others (i.e. escort someone to their car)

Team 2011 will need to be wearing their workforce uniform and accreditation pass to access free public transport.

Public Transport

Public transport will be the easiest way to get to and from Rotorua International Stadium. There will be shuttle from the city to venue on match days.

Car

Some parking is available around the venue but it is recommended that the Park and Ride service from the city to the stadium is used. There will be free public parking in town.

Walking

Rotorua International Stadium is a 3km walk from the central city. The route will be clearly signposted.

Late Night Transport

With evening games and Fanzone activities, a large number of the workforce will have shifts that run until late in the evening. All Team 2011 are encouraged to:

- · Travel in pairs or groups
- Use free public transport provided
- Ensure the health and safety of others (i.e. escort someone to their car)

■ Team Briefing "TEAMTALK"

- An **EXAMPLE** of great work being done



- ACTIONS or changes we need to know
- What to be AWARE of today



- MEETING time for debrief, and break times
- Where I will be if you need ME.



○ "RWC" FEEDBACK

As leaders we will have opportunities to provide feedback to the people in our team, our colleagues, or even visitors.

Here is a process that makes it easy and effective to give BOTH positive and constructive feedback to people.

REMEMBER – Don't let yourself skip to Step 3 too guickly. People will often come to the answer themselves if you take the time to discuss the example and impact of it.

Reacting TO A COMPLAINT

Managing complaints can feel difficult, but it comes down to our attitude towards the 'complaints' themselves. Rather than taking the complaint personally, if we treat every complaint as an opportunity to improve, we should be grateful, right!?

Let's think of every complaint the same way as when we're given any 'gift' - "Thank you!"

Here is a process to react to a complaint. Think of examples for your own Functional Area.

- 1. Thanks ("Thanks for letting me know!")
- 2. Why you're thanking them ("If you hadn't have told me, we might not have known")
- 3. What you'll do ("I'm going to...")
- Do it (It might relate to both this incident and a process that can made better)
- Follow up where appropriate ("We sorted it out. Thanks again for telling me").





D Team Debrief "THANKS"

For an effective and interactive debrief of the shift with your team, keep these things in mind:

- Encourage any positive stories to be shared wider than just your team – e.g. The Team 2011 Facebook group!
- Make sure you tell your supervisor about any incidents, or great work by your team (forms will be available at your Workforce Centre).
